

Advertisement in Newark Advertiser, 1864:

"39th New Jersey Regiment: Only one year! Recruits Wanted!

For the new regiment lately authorized to be raised, to whom the highest bounties will be paid. Look at the following figures: Bounty and pay \$864...Cash paid on muster, \$533.33. **Capt. George W. Harrison late of the 26th Regiment)** having received authorization to recruit a company for the 39th Regiment, has established his headquarters in Main Street, near Centre, Orange, where recruits will be received. The pay for married men in addition to rations and clothing, amounts to \$16.00 per week. For single men, \$15.60 per week." (Capt. Harrison, the H Company officer from September 1864 to his death at Petersburg, Virginia April 2, 1865, the Regiment's "Day of Glory".)
