

NEW JERSEY GOLF CLUBS TIED.

Glen Ridge, East Orange, and Morristown Even in State Series.

ORANGE, N. J., Aug. 4.—Morristown having defeated Glen Ridge in the last game for a month, now is tied with that team for first place. East Orange is also tied with these two, making the situation very interesting. No more games will be played in the East Jersey series until Sept. 7, when Glen Ridge and Forest Hill will meet. The standing of the teams is at present:

Of the three leading teams only two will play together again. On Sept. 14 East Orange will go to Morristown. On its own links East Orange defeated Morristown on June 22, and therefore it is extremely likely that the Morristown team will make its best efforts to capture the return game, especially as the championship may depend upon it. The champion for the league last year was Howard Giffin of the East Orange Golf Club, who has also made a brilliant record this year, not having as yet been beaten. He has played against such strong players as Place of Glen Ridge, Holmes of Morristown, Philip Poinier of Elizabeth, and Holton of Glen Ridge, and he has won by the highest possible score of three, which means that he was up in every case in playing both the first and the second half of the several links. He also defeated Hunter of Forest Hill by one up.
