

HERD OF DEER EXTERMINATED.

Five Animals Owned by Dr. Mandeville of South Orange All Dead.

SOUTH ORANGE, N. J., Oct. 1.—Dr. Henry A. Mandeville, who owns a large residence and park in Luddington Road, is mourning the loss of a herd of five deer which were recently turned loose in the park. For several weeks the deer thrived and were the admiration of the village.

A few weeks ago two of the animals were killed by lightning during a thunderstorm, after which two of the remaining ones became crazed by the confinement and noise, and dashed their brains out against the fence. On Tuesday a big dog got into the inclosure, and after a chase of several hours ran the last of the herd down before it was driven off by Dr. Mandeville's servants. The surviving deer broke its leg during the chase, and the animal was chloroformed yesterday.
