

## **NEW ORANGE HOSPITAL READY**

**Women Managers of a Rival Institution Said to be Unfriendly to It.**

ORANGE, June 12.—The first ward in the new Italian Roman Catholic Hospital here will be opened to-morrow. It will be called the ward of St. Anthony. The hospital itself will be called the Hospital of the Immaculate Conception. There are four separate buildings on Centre and Hurlbut Streets.

Father F. Victor Romanelli, the rector of the parish, who has had to meet some opposition to his new hospital, says he has heard that the women of the Board of Governors of the Orange Memorial Hospital have declared that any of the Memorial Hospital attending staff who minister to patients in Father Romanelli's hospital will be expected to resign from the Memorial staff. Father Romanelli has already enrolled two of the Memorial staff and developments are awaited with interest.

Father Romanelli says he started his hospital because his countrymen were unkindly treated by the attendants in another hospital.

## **BABY COUNTESS BORN HERE.**

**Its Mother a Kansas City Girl Who Married a Russian Nobleman.**

A little Countess was born to the Countess S. Mae Feist Leschinsky, wife of Count Judah L. Leschinsky of Russia yesterday in the Dudley Memorial Hospital, Brooklyn. The Count and Countess are visiting his sister-in-law at 163 South Ninth Street, Williamsburg. Should the baby live, and there is every indication that she will, she will inherit a large share of an estate in Russia.

The Countess is only twenty years old, and is the daughter of Louis Feist, a milliner of Kansas City. The Count is twenty-four, and is interested in the Southern Railroad of Russia. He came to this country a year ago to see the World's Fair and to make contracts for railroad material.

The Count met the Feist family at the St. Louis fair last Summer and fell in love with the daughter. The Count showed documents which proved him to be genuine, and after a courtship of two weeks they were married.
